Highlights from April 2017 NFPA U.S. Fire Department Profile Statistics (2015 Stats):

There were 1,160,450 career and volunteer firefighters in the United States in 2015.

- 30% (345,600) were career firefighters.
- 70% (814,850) were volunteer firefighters
- 29,727 fire departments protected the United States in 2015.
 - All Career 2,651
- Mostly Career 1,893
- Mostly Volunteer 5,421

• All Volunteer 19,762

In 2015, 7.3%, of the firefighters were female. Of the career firefighters 12,850 (3.7%) were female firefighters. There were 72,250 volunteer firefighters who were female, 8.9% of the total.

Half the fire service is 40 or more years old.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF

IT HAS NOW BEEN THREE YEARS SINCE THE FIRE DISTRICT DISCONTINUED CONTRACTING SERVICES WITH CENTRAL PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE AND RESUMED OPERATIONS INDEPENDENTLY. IT HAS BEEN A BUSY THREE YEARS WITH LOTS OF CHANGES AND HARD WORK FROM OUR DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS. WE BEGAN RESUMING OPERATIONS ON MAY 2ND 2014 UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF FIRE CHIEF TONY COOPER. IT FELT MUCH LIKE WE WERE STARTING A BRAND NEW DEPARTMENT TO THE OFFICERS AND COMMISSIONERS AS WE WORKED TIRELESSLY TO MAKE SURE OUR EQUIPMENT, FACILITIES, STAFFING AND TRAINING WERE ALL BACK TO NORMAL OPERATION. WE HAD MANY VOLUNTEERS AND OFFICERS RETURN BUT THAT STILL LEFT US WITH A SHORTAGE OF TRAINED STAFF. WE DID EXTENSIVE RECRUITING AND RAN OUR FIRST EVER IN



HOUSE FIRE ACADEMY THAT RESULTED IN A DOZEN TRAINED PERSONNEL. WE CONTINUE TO RECRUIT AND TRAIN NEW VOLUNTEERS TO A MINIMUM OF IFSAC FIREFIGHTER 1, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OPERATIONS AND EMT BASIC.

THROUGH A GENEROUS GRANT FROM THE PUYALLUP TRIBAL NATION FOR \$90,000, WE WERE ABLE TO UPDATE OUR COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS AND REMODEL OUR STATION. CONTINUED SUPPORT FROM OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH OUR EMS AND MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS LEVY HAS PRODUCED AN ADEQUATE OPERATING BUDGET. WITHOUT THIS FINANCIAL SUPPORT IT WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE TO RESUME THE HIGH LEVEL OF OPERATIONS THAT OUR COMMUNITY HAS COME TO EXPECT.

This Last year we saw the resignation of Chief Tony Cooper. The Board of Commissioners commented "Chief Cooper was very instrumental in the reopening of the Department three years ago, and for that he is due much credit, appreciation, and thanks. We wish him well!" With his resignation I have taken over as Interim Fire Chief while the board works to hire a new Fire Chief. I have been with Riverside Fire since 2005 when I started as a volunteer. While volunteering, aside from my extensive fire and EMS training, I completed my Bachelors Degree at the University of Washington and worked at Trimed Ambulance. I was hired as full time Battalion Chief for Riverside in February of 2015. I have had a love and passion for the fire service, this department and its community since the moment I started and I am proud to be working here full time and temporarily leading the department during this transition.

Wildland Fire Season

As summer has finally arrived, your firefighters spent the spring training on specialty responses that have an increase in frequency in the warmer summer months. Crews recently spent several days refreshing their training and improving their skills in wildland (brush fires) firefighting. Our fire district has a unique aspect in which we have a wildland urban interface component to deal with in the event of a large wildland fire. What this means is that there are areas where forest and heavy vegetation meet up with residential and commercial businesses with no natural break between them.

MANY OF OUR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS ARE CROSS TRAINED AS WILDLAND FIREFIGHTERS IN A PARTNERSHIP WITH WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES. IN THE

EVENT OF A LARGE FIRE RESPONSE IN THE STATE, FIREFIGHTERS FROM OUR DISTRICT WILL RESPOND TO ASSIST ANYWHERE THEY ARE NEEDED AS PART OF A STATE WIDE MOBILIZATION PLAN. NO NEED TO WORRY ABOUT COVERAGE HERE. OUR MAIN PRIORITY IS YOUR SAFETY AND PROVIDING SERVICES TO OUR COMMUNITY. THE FIRE **DISTRICT WILL SEND 2-4** PERSONNEL WITH ONE UNIT, EITHER A BRUSH ENGINE OR FIRE ENGINE.

SOME TIPS TO KEEP

YOUR HOME SAFE THIS SUMMER

- CLEAR NEEDLES, LEAVES AND OTHER DEBRIS FROM YOUR ROOF, GUTTERS AND EVES.
 - REMOVE FLAMMABLE ITEMS WITHIN 30 FEET OF ALL STRUCTURES, INCLUDING FIREWOOD PILES
- MAINTAIN A WELL HYDRATED LAWN, SHRUBS AND TREES AROUND YOUR HOME
- IF ITS BROWN, TRIM IT DOWN. CUT AND REMOVE ANY DRY GRASSES AND YARD DEBRIS FROM YOUR HOME
- SECURE PROPANE TANKS IN A AREA NOT SUSCEPTIBLE TO VEGETATION FIRES

IN **UNINCORPORATED PIERCE** COUNTY IT IS ILLEGAL TO POSSES AND DISCHARGE FIRECRACKERS, BOTTLE ROCKETS, MISSILE TYPE ROCKETS, AS WELL AS ANYTHING THAT CAN MAYBE CONSIDERED A BOMB. **ILLEGAL USE OF FIREWORKS** WILL RESULT IN FINES OR ADDITIONAL CONSEQUENCES FROM THE PIERCE COUNTY

- ONLY USE FIREWORKS PURCHASED FROM STATE LICENSED FIREWORKS STANDS-ILLEGAL FIREWORKS ARE SUBJECT TO CONFISCATION AND POSSIBLE CRIMINAL CHARGES.
- STORE FIREWORKS OUT OF CHILDREN'S REACH.
- KEEP PETS SAFE INDOORS. •

• ALWAYS KEEP WATER HANDY

BE SAFE... WHEN LIGHTING FIREWORKS

- ONLY RESPONSIBLE AND SOBER ADULTS SHOULD LIGHT FIRE-WORKS.
- ONLY USE FIREWORKS OUTDOORS.
- DO NOT THROW, HOLD OR LIGHT FIREWORKS IN YOUR HAND.
- PROTECT YOUR EYES, ALWAYS WEAR SAFETY GLASSES
- LIGHT ONE FIREWORK AT A TIME AND MOVE AWAY QUICKLY-NEVER RELIGHT A "DUD".

BE RESPONSIBLE ... AFTER YOU FINISH

- SOAK USED FIREWORKS IN WATER. •
- BE CONSIDERATE AND CLEAN UP USED FIREWORKS. •
 - REMEMBER FIREWORK DEBRIS BELONG IN THE TRASH, NOT THE RECYCLE BIN.
 - KEEP MATCHES AND LIGHTERS AWAY FROM CHILDREN.
