

## OUTDOOR BURNING

**OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL FIRE INFORMATION** AS THE WARMER MONTHS COME CLOSER WE WOULD LIKE TO REMIND YOU OF JUST WHAT IS AND ISN'T OK TO BURN OUTDOORS. WHAT IS AN APPROVED / AUTHORIZED OUTDOOR FIRE RECREATIONAL FIRE ARE ALLOWED IF BUILT IN METAL OR

CONCRETE LINED FIRE PITS LIKE THOSE FOUND IN CAMPGROUNDS, AND CAMPING STOVES. FIRE PITS CAN ALSO BE CONSTRUCTED OF BRICKS OR ROCKS.

- FIRES SHALL NOT EXCEED 3 FEET IN DIAMETER AND HEIGHT. •
- THE DEPTH OF THE PIT SHALL BE A MINIMUM OF 6 INCHES AND CAPABLE OF CONTAINING FIRE DEBRIS.
- FIRES SHALL CONSIST OF DRY SEASONED FIREWOOD, "DURA-FLAME/PRESTO • LOGS" OR CHARCOAL BRIQUETTES ONLY.
- A MINIMUM OF 10 FEET SHALL BE MAINTAINED AROUND THE ENTIRE PIT, FREE OF GRASS, SHRUBBERY, WEEDS, VEGETATION AND ANY OTHER COMBUSTIBLE MATERIAL, INCLUDING OVERHANGING LIMBS FROM TREES. FIRE SHOULD BE NO CLOSER THAN 25 FEET FROM ANY BUILDINGS.
- FIRES SHALL BE ATTENDED AT ALL TIMES BY AN ADULT WITH IMMEDIATE ACCESS TO A BUCKET OF WATER OR AN ACTIVE GARDEN HOSE.

#### WHAT IS A NOT-APPROVED / UN-AUTHORIZED OUTDOOR FIRE

- FIRES THAT CONTAIN GARBAGE, PAINT, PLYWOOD, FINISHED LUMBER OR PARTICLE BOARD, OR ANY PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SUCH AS TIRES, PLASTICS, GASOLINE MAY NOT BE BURNED. BURNING OF YARD WASTE IS ALSO NOT ALLOWED (NO BRANCHES, SHRUBBERY, OR WET WOOD).
  - BURN BARRELS SHALL NEVER BE USED FOR ANY TYPE OF BURNING.

## FIREWORK SAFETY

#### BE PREPARED... BEFORE YOU LIGHT FIREWORKS

- ONLY USE FIREWORKS PURCHASED FROM STATE LICENSED FIREWORKS STANDS
- STORE FIREWORKS OUT OF CHILDREN'S REACH.
- KEEP PETS SAFE INDOORS.

#### ALWAYS KEEP WATER HANDY. **BE SAFE... WHEN LIGHTING FIREWORKS**

- ONLY ADULTS SHOULD LIGHT FIREWORKS.
- ONLY USE FIREWORKS OUTDOORS. .
- DO NOT THROW FIREWORKS OR HOLD THEM.
- PROTECT YOUR EYES.

LIGHT ONE FIREWORK AT A TIME, MOVE AWAY QUICKLY-NEVER RELIGHT A "DUD". BE RESPONSIBLE ... AFTER YOU FINISH

- SOAK USED FIREWORKS IN WATER.
- BE CONSIDERATE AND CLEAN UP USED FIREWORKS. .
  - REMEMBER FIREWORK DEBRIS BELONG IN THE TRASH. NOT THE RECYCLE BIN.
    - KEEP MATCHES AND LIGHTERS AWAY FROM CHILDREN.

#### **HEAT EXHAUSTION**

#### Symptoms

- Faint or Dizzy
- Headache
- Profuse Sweating - Irritability
- Weak, Rapid Pulse
- Shallow Breathing
- Pale, Cool, Clammy Skin
- Nausea or Vomiting - Muscle Cramps

#### Treatment

1) Have victim lie down in a cool shaded area or air c<mark>onditioned area</mark>. 2) Drink water if victim is conscious 3) Use caution when victim stands up. apply cold compresses.

POTENTIAL SEVERE EXPOSURE. AS BEACHES. DRINK PLENTY

OF NON-ALCOHOLIC

FLUIDS, AND REPLACE THE BODY'S SALTS AND MINERALS, WHICH SWEATING CAN RELEASE. DO NOT TAKE SALT TABLETS UNLESS UNDER MEDICAL SUPERVISION.

DRESS INFANTS AND CHILDREN IN COOL, LOOSE • CLOTHING AND SHADE THEIR HEADS AND FACES FROM THE SUN WITH HATS OR AN UMBRELLA. PROVIDE PLENTY OF FRESH WATER FOR PETS, •

AND LEAVE THE WATER IN A SHADED AREA.

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### HEAT RELATED ILLNESS PREVENTION

DURING HEAT WAVES, FREQUENTLY CHECK ON PEOPLE AT RISK FOR HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS, SUCH AS THE ELDERLY, DISABLED OR HOMEBOUND PEOPLE.

NEVER LEAVE CHILDREN ALONE IN CARS, AND • ENSURE THAT CHILDREN CANNOT LOCK THEMSELVES IN AN ENCLOSED SPACE, SUCH AS A CAR TRUNK.

LIMIT SUN . EXPOSURE DURING MIDDAY HOURS AND Symptoms IN PLACES OF SUCH

**HEAT STROKE** 

- Absence of Sweating - Pulsating Headache - Hot, Red, Dry Skin - High Body Temp: Above 103 - Nausea or Vomiting - Strong, Rapid Pulse - Confusion - Convulsions - May Lose Conciousness **T**re<mark>atment</mark> DIAL 911 action to cool victim by any means. 2) Tak Place rap in wet towel l water.



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Our Volunteers are required to work (4) 12 hour shifts per month.

Department drills are Tuesdays 1830-2130 and again Friday 1000-1300



80% of drill attendance is required quarterly

All firefighters are required to complete a Fire Academy and obtain EMT-B within a year.

#### A GLANCE AT FIRE ACADEMY

THE TYPICAL DAY AT RIVERSIDE FIRE AND RESCUE'S TRAINING ACADEMY IS VERY BUSY. THERE ARE ACADEMIC AND PHYSICAL FITNESS COMPONENTS TO THE DAY, AND A LOT OF INFORMATION IS COMPRESSED INTO THE SCHEDULE. RIVERSIDE FIRE AND RESCUE TAKES PRIDE IN ITS EXTENSIVE TRAINING AND, AS A RESULT, RIVERSIDE





FIRE AND RESCUE'S FIREFIGHTERS ARE TRAINED TO THE HIGHEST LEVEL IN THE SHORT DURATION RECRUITS SPEND IN THE ACADEMY.

RECRUIT FIREFIGHTERS WILL SPEND 3 MONTHS IN RIVERSIDE FIRE AND RESCUE'S TRAINING ACADEMY. RECRUITS MUST BE SEATED AT THEIR desk prepared for the day at 1800 on 0800 WEEKDAYS WEEKENDS. AND ON The Recruit Academy typically runs every Monday and Wednesday from 1730 to 2130 and every other Saturday/Sunday from 0630 то 1700. AFTER GRADUATING THE

ACADEMY, EACH FIREFIGHTER TESTS FOR THEIR INTERNATIONAL FIRE SERVICE ACCREDITATION CONGRESS (IFSAC) FIREFIGHTER AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS CERTIFICATIONS. A PROFESSIONAL CREDENTIAL RECOGNIZING YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS AS A FIREFIGHTER.

RECRUITS SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR CLASSROOM LECTURES BY COMPLETING ALL ASSIGNMENTS PRIOR TO THAT DAYS INSTRUCTION. BECAUSE THE SCHEDULE IS DYNAMIC, ALL EQUIPMENT, BOOKS AND UNIFORMS SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO WORK EVERY DAY REGARDLESS OF THE EXPECTED SCHEDULE.
