

# Pierce County Fire Protection District No. 14 Commissioners Meeting January 24, 2022 Station74

In Attendance: Chief Kira Thirkield, Commissioner Jerry Sandberg, Commissioner Peter Allison, Commissioner John Campbell and Secretary Pat Shandrow

Commissioner Sandberg opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance at 6:30 p.m.

The minutes of the January 10, 2022 Regular Board Meeting were approved as presented.

Chief's Report: The Chief's Report was presented reviewed and attached.

### **Old Business:**

A. COVID-19: Mask mandates remain in effect in the state of Washington. The new Omicron variant is easily spread. No one in our Department has Covid at this time but one person was exposed and is quarantining as recommended by the Health Department.

### **New Business:**

A. New Contract - Cramer: The new Contract for Michael Cramer was presented to the Commissioners for review.

### Good of the Order

- Cramer worked an extra shift, which helped station coverage and training. Doug Thor attended the Buckley academy with our recruits to assist with training.
- On MLK Day Thor and Kira responded to an alarm at Chief Leschi School. A fire sprinkler on the upper floor had popped. The sprinkler system was shut down but had already flooded the entire top floor. An estimated half a million dollars in water damage occurred as water leaked from top floor down to the main level. The Department tried to move and cover computers and equipment as much as possible as the water came through the ceiling and light fixtures. Their facilities manager, Dave, was immediately notified. They thanked the Fire Department for their quick response as every minute saved caused less damage.
- Brazilian Jiu-jitsu is a new class in self-defense being taught to our firefighters. This is in hope of keeping our staff safer, do the curtailed support the police departments are allowed to provide during some of our calls.

With no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

# Chiefs Report December 2021

The month of December was an average month with 44 calls for service (December 2020 had 44 calls, with a 3-year avg of 38.33). Our year-to-date call count is at 627 service calls, which is 29% higher than last year which had 514 calls and 36% higher than the last three years average. We did not receive or provide mutual aid this month. Our priority response time was 5:47 and we had five BLS transports.

December has seen a massive amount of hiring, with us sending twice as many candidates as predicted to academy. We have onboarded 17 new members, with 10 attending Brown's Point Academy in February and seven (7) with Buckley's Academy beginning in January. Despite this record influx of members, staffing continues to be a constant battle. All academy spots are full, but the Department has opened up applications for EMT-only positions. Three have already been hired and interviews will be continuing throughout the next month at minimum.

December saw a snowstorm with one minor vehicle incident – the engine slid in the roadway while leaving to respond to a call. Only minor damage was sustained. The blue van has been service, in preparation for shuttling our new members to academy, and the back-up duty office rig was serviced with the intention of training Team Lead Maniago to use if for duty officer shifts. The station has seen recent construction improvements, with the kitchen stove hood vent being installed to enhance safety. Due to shortages of supplies, the construction on the new shower room and back office is still on delay.

Captain Cramer also finished his annual inventory of all assets, and Chief Thirkield continues to work on the state audit. The audit is taking longer than usual, which was anticipated, due to its necessary remote nature this year. Doug Thor has been taking on a large portion of training responsibilities, working with the new recruits to get them call-ready. The Administrative division has been preparing for 2022, updating files and making sure training and systems are in order for the upcoming year.

The focus of January will be staffing, hiring, and readying new candidates for Academy as well as supporting them during their education. Chief Thirkield will continue to work with the State on the audit.




